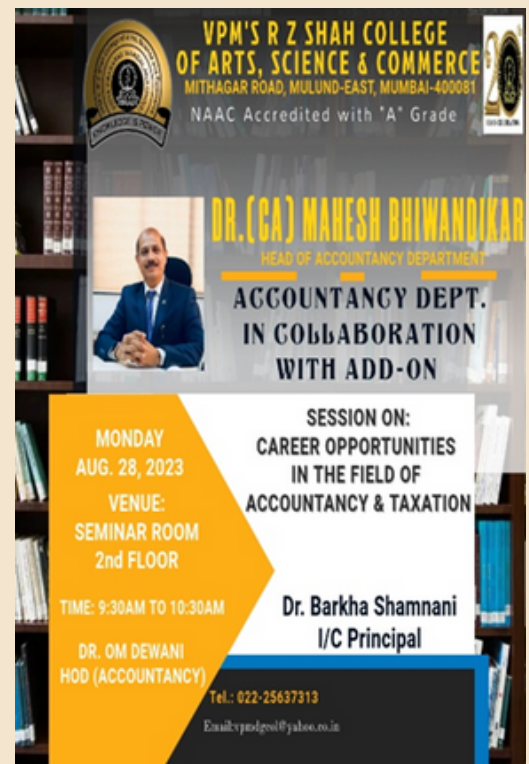
## 1) Guest Lecture on Career Opportunities in Accountancy and Taxation

Today, the role of a government is like a facilitator, focuses on every sector, simplified FDI norms and played a significant role in the post Covid global GVC reorientation that is at play.

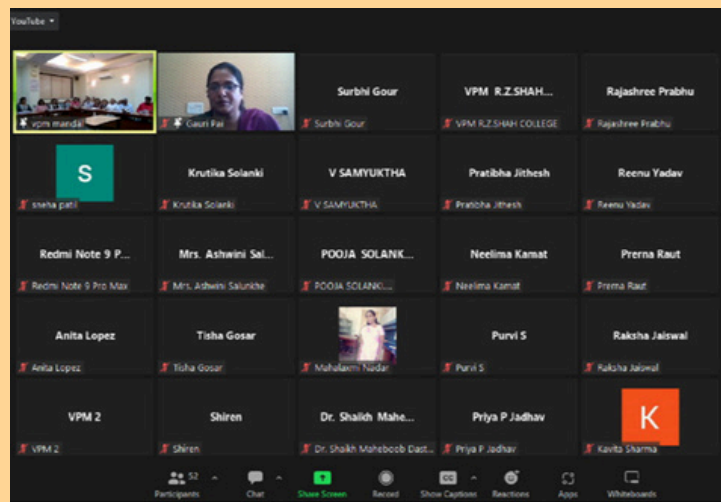

# OBJECTIVES :-

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To devise detailed procedure for an efficient, transparent, and fair evaluation of students, including coordination of activities relating to conduct of examinations and reviewing grievances about any matter originating from the conduct of examinations.

# FUNCTIONS:-

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- The Exam Cell shall distribute the exam forms of the University to regular students (the fees for the same are collected as part of the college fees) and collect them back after having them duly filled in.
- To conduct the Internal/ External/ Practical Examinations for all the programmes offered in the College.
- The Exam Committee shall hold a pre-examination meeting to brief the members of faculty with regard to the examination procedures and the role and responsibilities of the report of the same shall be submitted to the Principal.
- To prepare Time Table for the above-mentioned examinations in advance and inform the students about the same.
- The Exam Committee shall prepare and display an overall supervision duty list as well as daily supervision duty list on the staff notice board.
- The Exam Committee shall ensure that adequate stationery like answer sheets, drawing sheets, charts, graph papers, drawing boards, trays, threads, water jugs etc. are made available.
- Committee should collect examiners' names for assessment and moderation of each subject from respective HODs.
- To allot the exam halls for all the examinations conducted in the College.
- To ensure that all the question papers are prepared well in advance.
- To collect all the answer scripts and the supporting documents required.
- To arrange for External/Internal Valuation of Exams.
- To publish the results and take necessary steps for the smooth conduct of supplementary exams in time.

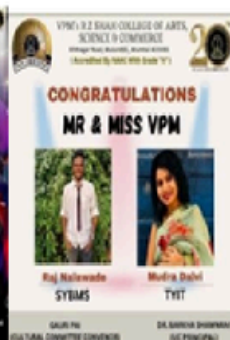
# CULTURAL COMMITTEE

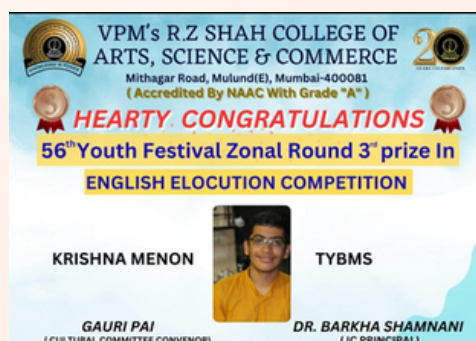
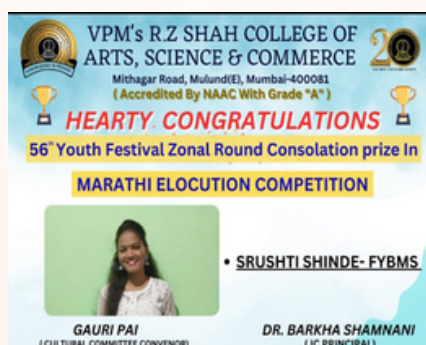


## Freshers Party

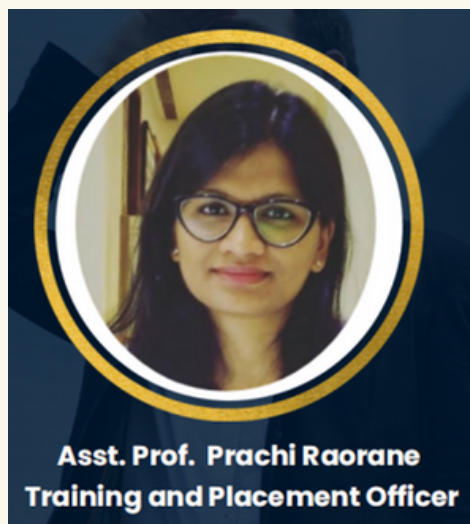


## GURU POURNIMA CELEBRATION

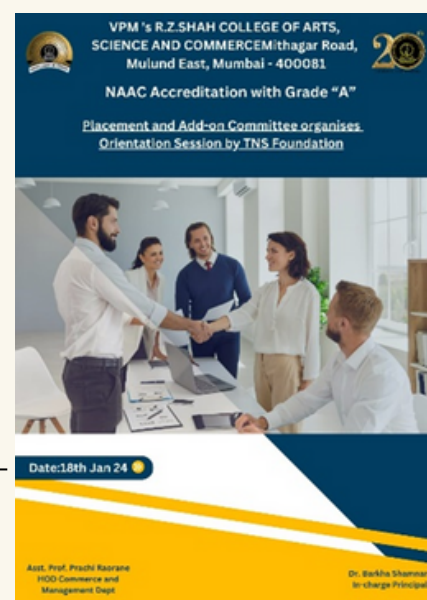

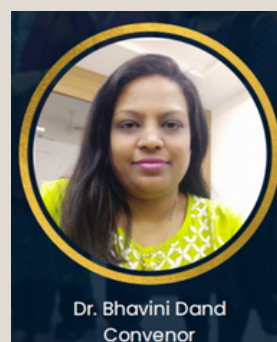

# ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL



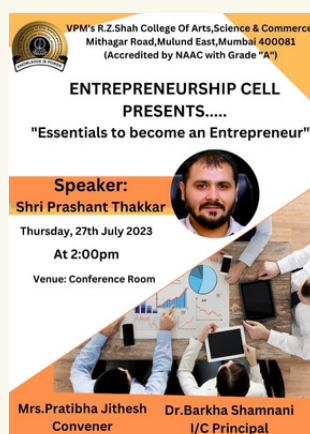

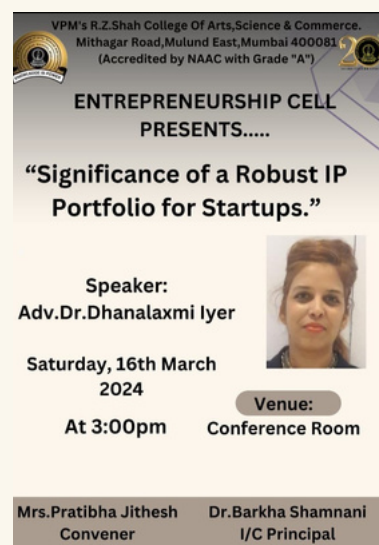

(7th & 8th February 2024)

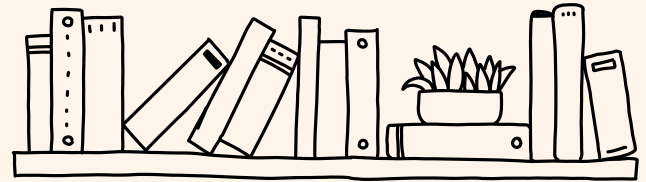

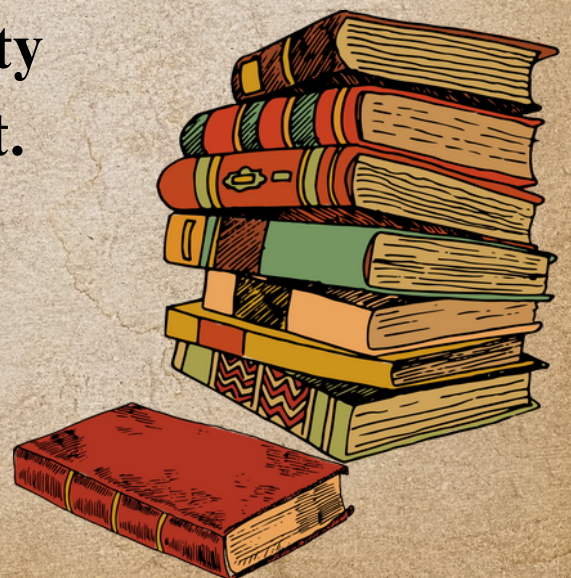

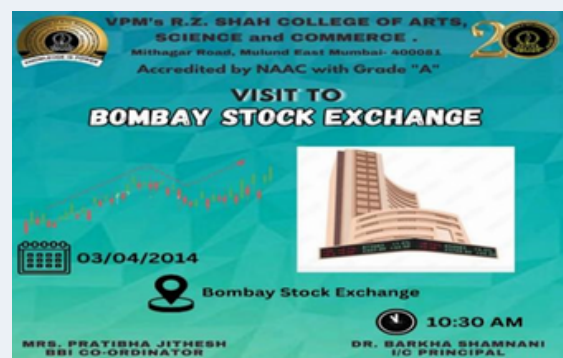
## 7) Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE)

At the end, the constitutional law expert judging in the debate shed light on the constitutional provisions and legal implications of implementing a UCC. 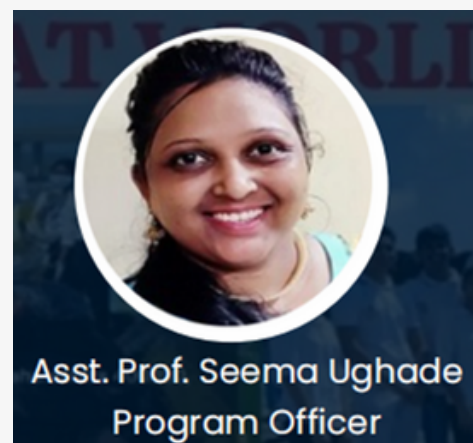

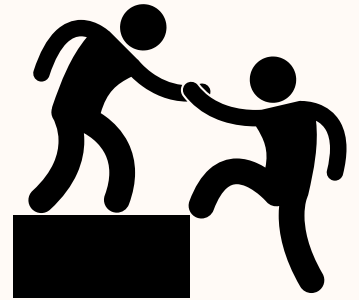

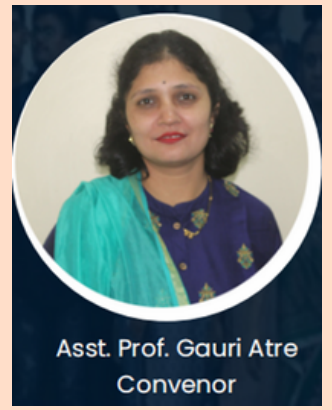








# ATHANG MARATHI VANGMAY MANDAL



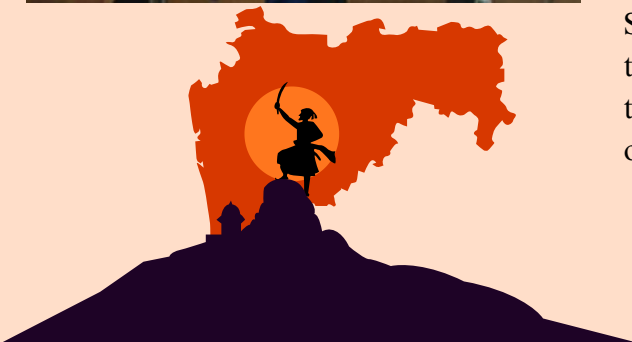
## (1) ASHADI EKADASHI DINDI

## A) Mentor-Mentee-Parent Interaction Sessions

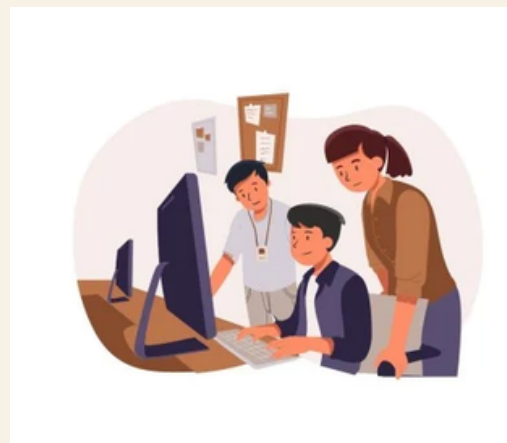

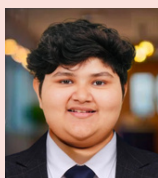

# **FAMILY PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT**

India is exceeding China in the population growth. A few months back China was first and India was second in the rank of population. But now India is FIRST! It means India is successful in the highest growth of population which is very dangerous for sustainable development, isn't it?

It is necessary for us to know what is family planning and what is sustainable development, especially for Indian Yuvas. College platform is the best platform and students are the best Yuvas.

Family planning is 'to plan a family', with limited number of children and limited number members. It is directly related with the economic condition and fulfillment of requirements like food, shelter and clothing, schooling and giving best possible facilities to all. The other meaning of family planning is helping couples to have children and that also healthy children.

Family Planning was applied about 250 years back in USA and other European countries. And also, World Wars cut down living population in war fields. But in India, it started in 1952 along with the first five-years plan and Health Ministry. In 1952 Family Planning Association of India was started, working all over India as a guideline to bring an awareness of health and family planning to the people of India. Some of the great medical and non-medical stalwarts like Dr. B. N. Purandare, Dr. D. N. Pai, Achutrao Patwardhan, Mr. Sanjay Gandhi (during emergency), worked day and night to bring an awareness of small family and healthy family. Through Community Development Program (CDP) governments worked for an all-round better health and life for Indian people.



More than a decade from 1970 to 1978 Family Planning as a crucible government program worked seriously with the aim of controlling the growing population.

During the emergency there were forcible sterilization camps did lot of work with many wrongdoings, such as, sterilizing on a bachelor, sterilizing on both the couple etc. Due to excesses of sterilization camps, Mrs. Gandhi's government collapsed, winning only 153 MPs. In 1977 Prime Minister Morarjee Desai and Health Minister Raj Narian completely neglected family planning and sterilization account became zero in India. In 1977 the name of Family Planning was changed into Family Welfare, but without welfare. According to the survey conducted by the Health Bulletin of the then Bombay Municipal Corporation, Greater Bombay spacing methods were popular. According to Dr. D. N. Pai, the former Special Officer of Family Planning and Professor and Head, Department of Preventive Social Medicine, King Edward Medical College, Parel Mumbai 400012, inspired Bombay people in his various lectures by emphasizing the following programs.

- Awareness (about small family)
- Education (educating people about health and small family)
- Motivation (talking to the people of high population and less comforts)
- Inspiration (inspiring the couples to visit hospitals and family planning centers)
- Action (sterilization - vasectomy & tubectomy)
- Incentives (boosting through incentives and gifts as sanctioned by the governments)
- Follow up (find out whether couples are happy or not)

In these days the central and state governments are worried about the growing population as birth rates are more and death rates are less. This is becoming a challenge and great obstruction for economic growth, provision of education, health, housing and employment for all.

Though India is fifth largest economy in the world and trying to become third in the world, controlling of abnormal growth of population in India is the great obstacle. If population is not controlled India's situation becomes serious at present and in future also.

Sustainable Development, means, balanced development in the society. Taking care of the present and future society of balancing not only human society, but taking care of the nature and all species in the nature. But Indian rural people are busy in destroying the forests and tilling more and more land to get more commercial crops. In urban society everywhere buildings and roads are constructed to accommodate city population. Suburbs coming up with roads, flyover bridges, double roads, railway tracks metro trains and mini trains.

Everywhere pollution is causing disturbance, increasing health hazards. Pharmaceutical companies are manufacturing various medicines to control diseases. Is it a fine sustainable development? Doubtful. However, state and central governments are trying to provide water (Ghar, Ghar Jal, Swatchh Bharat Abhiyan, Toilet for all families, Sarva Shikshana Abhiyan, Ayushyamaan Bharat (health for all) and free food grain for all.

If we just travel rural society, we notice all villages have Primary School, in the vicinity of 4-5 villages, there is High School and Junior College, ITI. Number of industries and factories are providing jobs to the rural youngsters. In the vicinity of 50 kms., school, college students are given free passes to get education and become get jobs.

The topics Family Planning and Sustainable Development are endless. I put a full stop, remembering Lord James Kynes the British economist that there is no question of unemployment, there is always full employment. I remind you readers Dr.

Malthus, that, there is no need of population control since nature has got power to control and adjust with the world
